

# The First Hair Cut

## Journaling Brainstorms

- “Top 5-10” about first hair cut
  - Pictures / pages of each
- Was this a scheduled hair cut, or, one as a result of the child’s attempt at cutting his/her own hair?
- If the child cut their own hair, how did you find out? What did the child do, say?
  - Pictures of child with scissors, close up of area cut
- Did you do anything special before / after (lunch, toy, celebrate)
  - Pictures of activities
- How old was child? How long was it from time he / she ‘really needed a hair cut’ to the time you finally did it?
- How did you explain the haircut to the child (any funny names, explanations)
- Who went with the child? (both parents, siblings, special doll or toy)
- How did the child do? (cry, scream, giggle because it tickled)
  - Pictures of your child
- Did you cry when they started to cut?
- What did the child say after the cut?
  - Pictures of before / after
- Have your child draw a picture – include it in your album
- Keep the receipt from the transaction
- Save a piece of the child’s hair in a clear photo safe sleeve
